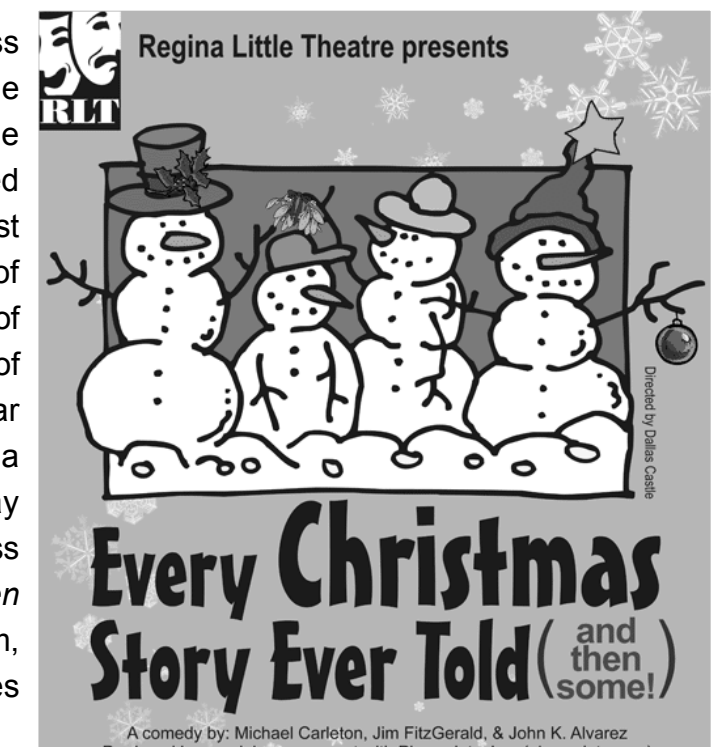

RLT: This play has fun with holiday traditions. Are there any special holiday traditions in your family?
