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Director Ken Spencer envisions a gripping blend of familiarity and freshness in Agatha Christie's Murder on the Orient Express, but first he

Auditions for Orient Express, the first show of the 2023-24 season, will be held downstairs at the Regina Performing Arts Centre on Monday and Tuesday, July 24-25, at 7:30 p.m. Participants are encouraged to arrive 10-15 minutes early in order to fill out the audition form.

The adaptation by Ken Ludwig will run Oct. 4-7 at the Regina Performing Arts Centre with performances Wednesday through Saturday evenings at 7:30 p.m., and a Saturday matinee at 1:30 p.m.

"Ludwig's version retains all the overall seriousness of an Agatha Christie murder mystery, while at the same time injecting a few moments of lightness and humour, and he keeps the pace well up throughout," says Spencer.

"Fans of the original novel and of the movies will note that Ludwig's play has only eight suspects, and not the original 13. He has judiciously kept only those who are most important and necessary to the plot.

"Most of the 12 roles in this show are for older adults, with only three of the characters being under the age of 30. I anticipate the older adults in the cast will feature a blend of new and familiar faces for RLT audiences."

Christie's estate has always been careful about approving adaptations of her work, and reportedly approached Ludwig to take on **Orient** Express. It was quite a departure for comedically-inclined Ludwig, who has had six plays staged by RLT over the past 12 years: The Three Musketeers, Leading Ladies, The Game's Afoot, Lend Me a Tenor, Moon Over Buffalo and A Fox on the Fairway.

This will be Spencer's second time undertaking an Agatha Christie mystery for RLT, having previously directed Black Coffee back in 2001.

Co-production!

Regina Little Theatre and Lexeme Theatre will present a staged reading of Does My Head Look Big in This? on Friday, September 15, 7:30 p.m., in the Regina Performing Arts Centre auditorium.

The play, by Jeff Gottesfeld and Elizabeth Wong, is based on the young adult novel by Randa Abdel-Fattah and tells the story of Amal, a 16-year-old American Muslim girl who decides to wear a hijab full-time. Amal desires to properly practise her faith despite parental warnings and the ostracizing and bullying that follows. She faces the consequences with humour and intelligence.

Ayesha Mohsin, artistic director of Lexeme Theatre, will serve as co-producer and co-director of the staged reading with the assistance of RLT's Brad McDougall as co-producer and Nora Berg as co-director.

Lexeme Theatre has been led by Ayesha, a Pakistani immigrant, since 2019 with the aim of serving the local Indo-Pakistani community.

Regina Little Theatre's Volunteer Appreciation Gala on June 16 featured the presentation of a new award honouring the late Rick Harvey.

Harvey, who passed away in December 2021, was involved with RLT over the course of five decades and was renowned as a superb set designer, builder and decorator. His last contribution was to create the stunning red door that anchored the set in the 2013 production of **Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde**.

To acknowledge Rick's enormous contributions and perpetuate his memory, RLT has established the **Red Door Award for Outstanding Visual Accomplishment**. Our first recipient is Pat Wilson, whose many years of fine work continued this past season with her set designs for **Great Expectations** and **Making God Laugh**, the latter distinctive for its charming fence.

The Samuel Goodfellow Award, the "Sammy," for valuable contribution to RLT and theatre in general, went to Lana de Lint, who has augmented her onstage efforts with her assistance to provide bar service at every show last season. Besides all the work involved in setting up, serving and tearing down, Lana also manned the bar with good cheer and efficiency.

Named after Fred Gallagher, **the "Freddy"** is given to "unsung heroes who are the heart of RLT." Our 2023 recipient is Joanne Wehrle, a longtime volunteer who has been especially busy the past year helping board member Nora Berg update and organize our voluminous archival material. As RLT approaches its centennial, Joanne's enthusiasm and attention to detail have been valuable in ensuring that our history will be well preserved.

Finally, **the "Jacqui,"** honouring the late Jacqui Shumiatcher, cites philanthropic support from an individual or agency and goes to Regina realtor Kim Oberthier. Kim has supported RLT on and around the stage for years and has been generous in her donations that brought back the Friday night Green Room Parties after their pandemic-enforced absence.

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Renewals

So you've seen the lineup for Regina Little Theatre's 98th season and, dazzled by its quality, you're keen to buy a subscription.

Well, first off, thank you. Subscribers are what keeps RLT going.

Here's what you can do to ensure your tickets for 2023-24:

If you were an RLT subscriber in 2022–23 and you want to maintain your reserved seats, you have until Friday, August 25 to renew through the Regina Performing Arts Centre box office.

If you were an RLT subscriber in 2022-23 and you want to change to different reserved seats, you can do so the week before Labour Day – that is, from August 28 through September 1.

If you are a new subscriber and purchase your tickets before Labour Day, you can purchase "flex" seating. This will not give you reserved seats, but you will have the flexibility of attending shows for any performance you please (Wednesday through Saturday nights, or Saturday matinee).

If you are a new subscriber who prefers reserved seating for a specific night or matinee, you will have to wait until after Labour Day to make your purchase. This policy allows renewing subscribers to maintain or upgrade their reserved seating.

Until Labour Day, the RPAC box office (1077 Angus Street) is open Monday through Thursday from noon to 5 p.m., and Friday from noon to 4 p.m. After Labour Day, the Monday through Thursday hours are noon to 8 p.m. Subscriptions can be handled either in person or over the telephone at 306-779-2277.

Subscription prices for 2023-24 are \$115 for adults and \$99 for seniors (55 and over), students and youths aged 18 and under. Individual show admissions are \$30 for adults, \$26 for seniors, students and youths, and \$12 for children 12 and under. The children's pricing is available for Saturday matinees only. No tax is added to these prices as amateur productions are exempt from taxation.
